



1992 -1995 CIVIC Interior & Exterior Label Replacement Instructions

Step 1:

For best results, you may consider removing switches from the vehicle before applying the labels. Although, all labels can be applied while the switches and other components are still mounted to the vehicle, please use your best judgement on what you feel more comfortable with.

Step 2:

Remove existing labels **where applicable**. You will only remove existing labels for those listed below:

- Hazard
- Lock
- Trunk Release
- Hood Release
- Fuel Release

For the rest of the interior switches (listed below), **you will leave the existing graphics in place**. These are one with the switches, removing these will remove the surface needed to install the new decal.

- Front Fog Lights
 - Defrost
- Rear Fog Light
- Cruise Control

Step 3:

Thoroughly clean surfaces where the new labels will be applied with the alcohol prep pad (provided). Due to the adhesive previously applied on many of these components, do not towel dry upon wiping with the prep pad. Particles from the towel will tend to stick to these components.

Note: If you have switches that are extremely worn and damaged you will want to smooth them out as much as possible. We would suggest a very fine grit sandpaper followed by a thorough cleaning.

Step 4:

Apply the new decals. For the switch decals that have a cutout for a light, it is best to remove this cutout while still on the decal sheet. This can be done by lifting a corner of the decal until the center is off the paper and then poking the cutout through with the plastic pick that was provided. Then, use this pick to lightly attach a corner of each of the new decals. Be sure that all decal and pick surfaces are clean & dry. The smallest spec of dirt or debris can alter the success of this installation. These decals are printed on a pressure sensitive material. This means that the more pressure you apply when applying the decals, the more permanent they will become. Take your time to make sure that decals are placed in the center of items so that they are as close to identical to what was there.
